



Nouns

1. Nouns are people, places, or things, and if they are capitalized, then they are called proper nouns.
2. Nouns can also be singular or plural. Plural just means more than one.
3. Nouns are different than pronouns. I will share some examples of sentences to explain.

In each example, the nouns are underlined.

A. Sioux Lookout is a beautiful place.
It is a beautiful place.

**“It” is a pronoun.
DO NOT underline it.**

B. I would like a new truck in the summer.

NOTE: "I" is a pronoun. DO NOT underline it.

C. The weather is warm in the spring.
It is warm in the spring.

**“It” is a pronoun.
DO NOT underline it.**

Proper noun	Common noun	Plural noun
Sioux Lookout	city	cities
Bonnie	woman	women
Mr. Zappa	teacher	teachers

ALSO REMEMBER:

There are three articles: the, a, an.

Articles are often written before nouns.

Use "a" before a consonant: a book

Use "an" before a vowel: an adventure

Use "an" before a vowel sound: an Xbox
