

- 1. Nouns are people, places, or things, and if they are capitalized, then they are called proper nouns.
- 2. Nouns can also be singular or plural. Plural just means more than one.
- 3. Nouns are different than pronouns. I will share some examples of sentences to explain.

## In each example, the nouns are underlined.

A. <u>Sioux Lookout</u> is a beautiful <u>place</u>. It is a beautiful <u>place</u>.

"It" is a pronoun.

DO NOT underline it.

B. I would like a new <u>truck</u> in the <u>summer</u>.

NOTE: "I" is a pronoun. DO NOT underline it.

C. The <u>weather</u> is warm in the <u>spring</u>. It is warm in the <u>spring</u>.

"It" is a pronoun.

DO NOT underline it.

Proper noun	Common noun	Plural noun
Sioux Lookout	city	cities
Bonnie	woman	women
Mr. Zappa	teacher	teachers

## **ALSO REMEMBER:**

There are three articles: the, a, an.

Articles are often written before nouns.

Use "a" before a consonant: a book

Use "an" before a vowel: an adventure

Use "an" before a vowel sound: an Xbox
